## How to Make Your Cardboard Projects Successful

#### 1. Gather Your Materials

- Cardboard sheets or old boxes
- Cutting tool: craft knife or strong scissors
- Adhesive: hot glue gun, tacky glue, or double-sided tape
- Ruler, pencil, and optional paint or markers
- 2. Plan & Sketch First
  - Draw a simple diagram of your idea.

• Label dimensions and note where folds or joints go.

#### 3. Score Before Folding

- Lightly cut a shallow line where you want a clean fold.
- Makes for sharper edges and prevents cracking.

#### 4. Work in Layers

- For strength, glue multiple layers of cardboard together.
- Use smaller support pieces ("braces") inside your structure.

#### 5. Finish & Decorate

- Paint with acrylics or cover with colored paper.
- Add stickers, washi tape, or textures like fabric.

## **Tips for Choosing the Best Cardboard Project**

- Intermediate: moving parts (drawers, hinges).
- Advanced: complex structures (furniture models, lamps).
- 3. Consider Purpose
  - Decorative vs. functional (e.g., storage boxes vs. jewelry stand).
- 4. Time & Space
  - Estimate how many hours it will take.
  - Make sure you have enough workspace and ventilation (for glue fumes).
- 5. Available Materials
  - Thicker double-wall cardboard is sturdier for large items.
  - Single-wall is easier to cut and bend for small crafts.
