How to Create Great Kindergarten Art Ideas

1. **Pick a Simple Theme:** Seasons, animals, letters, or storybook characters.
2. **Use Safe, Everyday Materials:** Construction paper, cotton balls, recyclables.
3. **Keep Steps Clear (3–5 max):** Short instructions match young attention spans.
4. **Incorporate Senses:** Texture (glitter, sand), scents (flower petals), or movement (wind chimes).
5. **Invite Child Input:** Let their favorite color or shape guide the project.

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Drawing

1. **Rainbow Shapes**

Have the children draw big circles, squares, and triangles, then color each shape in rainbow order to practice color recognition and shapes.

2. **My Family Portrait**

Ask kids to draw their family members with simple stick figures and add details like hair color and clothes to encourage personal expression.

3. **Animal Silhouettes**

Show black outline templates of animals; children fill them with patterns (dots, stripes), fostering pattern awareness.

4. **Underwater Scene**

Kids sketch fish, seaweed, and bubbles using crayons, helping them learn about sea life and practice curved lines.

5. **Self-Portrait Mirrors**

Give each child a small mirror to look at their face and draw what they see, building observation and motor skills.

6. **Alphabet Doodles**

Children choose a letter and draw objects that start with it (A for apple, B for ball) to link letters and images.

7. **My Favorite Toy**

Kids draw and color their favorite toy, promoting storytelling and fine-motor control.

8. **Weather Chart**

Have them draw sun, clouds, or rain for each day's weather and display in class, reinforcing daily routines.

9. **Line Art Fun**

Provide straight- and wavy-line stencils; children trace and decorate between lines, building control.

10. **Fruit Basket**

Kids draw several fruits in a basket and color, learning shapes and practice hand-eye coordination.

11. **Silly Monsters**

Encourage imagination by having children draw monsters with big eyes and funny teeth using crayons.

12. **Garden of Flowers**

Children sketch simple tulips, daisies, and sunflowers and color them, improving petal-shaping skills.

13. Happy Faces

Kids draw circles and add eyes, nose, and big smiles, practicing face parts and emotional recognition.

14. House on a Hill

Ask them to draw a house, a hill, and a sun, reinforcing perspective (foreground vs. background).

15. Favorite Food

Children illustrate what they love to eat—pizza, ice cream—and color, linking art to personal interests.

16. Insect Parade

Kids draw caterpillars, ladybugs, and butterflies, helping learn about bugs and practice oval shapes.

17. My Dream Playground

Let them imagine swings and slides, sketch them, and color, encouraging creativity and spatial thinking.

18. Outer Space

Children draw rockets, stars, and planets, practicing round shapes and lines.

19. Transportation Fun

Kids sketch cars, buses, and bikes, reinforcing basic vehicle shapes and color matching.

20. Magical Castle

Have them draw a castle with towers and flags, stimulating fantasy and straight-line drawing skills.

Painting

21. Blow-Paint Flowers

Drop diluted washable paint on paper and blow with straws to form petals, teaching cause and effect.

22. Handprint Rainbow

Paint each finger a different color, press hands on paper in an arc, creating a rainbow shape and sensory fun.

23. Salt Painting

Draw lines in glue, sprinkle salt, then drip liquid watercolor; colors spread along the salt lines.

24. Sponge Stamping

Cut sponges into shapes (circle, star); dip in paint and stamp, building pattern recognition.

25. Bubble Wrap Print

Paint bubble wrap and press paper onto it for a fun dotted texture print.

26. Marble Rolling Art

Place paint-covered marbles in a box with paper and tilt back and forth to make abstract art.

27. Sand Painting

Mix sand with colored glue, squeeze onto paper for a textured masterpiece.

28. Q-Tip Pointillism

Use Q-tips dipped in paint to make dot pictures, improving control.

29. Leaf Rubbing Art

Place leaves under paper and brush paint over to reveal veins and textures.

30. Glow-In-The-Dark Paint

Use safe glow paint for nighttime projects on black paper.

31. String Pull Painting

Dip string in paint, lay on paper, then pull to create swirls and lines.

32. Bubble Painting

Mix paint and bubble solution, blow bubbles onto paper for pop-art effects.

33. Watercolor Resist

Draw with white crayon, then paint over with watercolor; the drawing resists paint.

34. Tie-Dye Paper

Crumple paper, spray with watercolor, then flatten to see marble patterns.

35. Handprint Fish

Print a hand in paint sideways, add eyes and fins to make a fish, combining painting and drawing.

36. Symmetry Painting

Fold paper in half with paint on one side, press to transfer paint symmetrically.

37. Fruit Stamping

Cut apples or potatoes in half, dip in paint, and stamp to make flower shapes.

38. Daisy Chain Painting

Dip paper edges in paint and pull chains of color inward for flower-like

patterns.

39. **Tissue Paper Staining**

Lay colored tissue paper on wet paper; when dry, remove tissue to reveal stained shapes.

40. **Ice-Cube Painting**

Freeze colored water in trays, then use melting colored ice cubes to paint.

Collage

41. **Torn Paper Collage**

Tear colored paper scraps and glue onto a shape outline for a textured collage.

42. **Magazine Mosaic**

Cut small colored squares from magazines and glue to form a picture—like a mosaic.

43. **Nature Collage**

Glue leaves, petals, and small sticks onto paper to make a natural scene.

44. **Paper Plate Faces**

Use paper plates, add yarn hair and paper features to create funny faces.

45. **Tissue Paper Sun**

Crumple yellow tissue bits and glue in a circle for a bright sun collage.

46. **Foil Fish**

Cut foil into scales, glue onto fish outlines for shiny underwater art.

47. **Fabric Scraps Collage**

Use small fabric pieces to fill in shapes like houses or animals, teaching textures.

48. **Egg Carton Flowers**

Cut carton cups to shape petals, paint, and glue onto paper for 3D flowers.

49. **Recycled Box City**

Cut small boxes, wrap in paper, and glue onto cardboard for a cityscape collage.

50. **Paper Cone Trees**

Roll green paper into cones, decorate, and glue to make forest scenes.

51. **Story Collage**

Children illustrate a favorite story by gluing cut-outs onto paper.

52. Yarn Art

Glue lengths of yarn in patterns—spiders, rainbows—for tactile fun.

53. Button Butterflies

Glue buttons as butterfly bodies and yarn for antennae on colored paper.

54. Leaf Crown

Glue leaves onto a paper strip to make wearable crowns.

55. Alphabet Collage

Glue pictures of items that start with each letter onto letter cut-outs.

56. Seasonal Tree

Glue cotton balls for winter snow, tissue pieces for fall leaves, etc., on a tree outline.

57. Glue-And-Glitter

Draw with glue and sprinkle glitter for sparkly art (use washable glitter).

58. Photo Collage

Glue small photos of the child and decorate around them, reinforcing self-identity.

59. Junk Mail Collage

Reuse unwanted mail by cutting and gluing colorful bits into abstract art.

60. Foam Shape Art

Provide foam stickers of shapes to arrange and stick on paper for easy collage.

Printmaking

61. Vegetable Prints

Dip broccoli or carrots in paint and stamp to make flowers or trees.

62. Bubble Wrap Print

(Repeat idea? Actually bubble wrap was painting; here we emphasize ink printing.) Roll ink on bubble wrap and press paper for textured backgrounds.

63. Leaf Printing

Paint leaves and press onto paper for botanical prints.

64. Toy Car Tracks

Dip toy car wheels in paint and roll across paper for fun tracks.

65. Foam Plate Stamps

Stick foam shapes on bottle caps, dip in paint, and stamp patterns.

66. Pencil Eraser Prints

Use the eraser end of pencils dipped in paint to make small dots.

67. Potato Stamp Animals

Carve simple animal shapes into potatoes for stamping.

68. Handprint Tree

Use brown paint for trunk, green handprints for leaves, combining print and paint.

69. Bubble Print Frames

Make bubble mix with paint, bubble onto paper, and frame around a drawing.

70. Plastic Fork Grass

Dip the tines of a plastic fork in green paint and stamp grass blades.

71. String Stamp Prints

Dip string in ink and stamp loops and curves on paper.

72. Cardboard Tube Rings

Cut toilet paper tubes into rings, dip in paint, and stamp circles.

73. Pinecone Prints

Roll pinecones in paint and press for pine-textured prints.

74. Footprint Bugs

Help children dip feet in paint and stamp, then add antennae to turn prints into bugs.

75. Sponge Roller Prints

Wrap sponge around a rolling pin, dip in paint, and roll for patterns.

76. Foil Plate Rubbing Prints

Place paper over embossed foil plates and rub with crayons to reveal designs.

77. Bubble Wrap Monoprint

(Similar to #62, but with a unique twist: press only once for monoprint.)

78. Toy Stampers

Use small plastic stamp toys with ink pads for easy prints.

79. Leaf Rubbing Prints

Crayon-rubbing over leaves gives a print-like effect.

80. Gumdrops Print Flowers

Dip gumdrops on skewers in paint and stamp as flower petals.

Sculpture

81. Playdough Animals

Provide colored playdough to shape simple animals, boosting fine-motor skills.

82. Clay Leaf Imprints

Press leaves into air-dry clay and let dry to preserve nature's textures.

83. Recycled Bottle Cap Art

Glue bottle caps together to form caterpillars or snakes for 3D fun.

84. Paper Mâché Bowls

Use torn paper and glue over a bowl mold; when dry, paint the bowl.

85. Pipe Cleaner Critters

Twist pipe cleaners into spiders, worms, and butterflies.

86. Cardboard Roll Creatures

Decorate toilet-paper rolls with paper and markers to make animals.

87. Magnet Sculptures

Provide magnetic shapes and let children build on a board.

88. Pom-Pom Snowman

Glue white pom-poms in a stack, add googly eyes and a scarf for winter art.

89. Foam Block Towers

Stack foam blocks and let kids paint and decorate their own towers.

90. Salt Dough Decorations

Shape salt dough into ornaments, bake, then paint.

91. Bead Necklaces

String large beads onto yarn for wearable art and motor practice.

92. Marshmallow & Toothpick Structures

Connect marshmallows with toothpicks to build simple shapes.

93. Egg Carton Bugs

Cut and paint egg carton cups, add pipe cleaners for legs and antennae.

94. Tin Foil Sculptures

Crumple foil into shapes—animals, letters—for shiny sculptures.

95. Paper Cup Stacking

Decorate cups, then stack to form towers or castles.

96. Cardboard Mask Making

Cut mask shapes from cardboard, decorate, and tie with yarn.

97. Nature Sticks Sculpture

Glue sticks vertically and horizontally on cardboard for twig houses.

98. Balloon Clay Pots

Press clay around a small balloon; when clay firms, pop the balloon for a pot.

99. Foam Sticker Sculpture

Layer foam stickers on stiff paper to build dimensional art.

100. Recycled CD Fish

Decorate old CDs with paint and paper fins to make shiny fish.

Nature Art

101. Rock Painting

Collect smooth stones, paint animals or patterns, then display in garden.

102. Leaf Crowns

Glue leaves onto a paper band to make nature crowns.

103. Twig Frames

Glue small twigs around a cardboard frame for rustic photo holders.

104. Flower Press Art

Press flowers in books, then glue onto paper to design cards.

105. Pinecone Owls

Paint pinecones, add felt eyes and beaks for woodland creatures.

106. Sand Art Bottles

Layer colored sand in bottles to make rainbow patterns.

107. Shell Mosaics

Glue small shells onto paper in patterns for beach scenes.

108. Nature Weaving

Create a cardboard loom, weave grass and ribbons for texture study.

109. Mud Painting

Mix mud and water to paint earth-tone pictures on cardboard.

110. Flower Petal Sun

Arrange petals around a paper circle to mimic the sun's rays.

111. Seed Collage

Glue different seeds (rice, beans) onto shapes to make textured art.

112. Grass Print

Dip grass blades into paint and press as brushes.

113. Tree Bark Rubbing

Rub crayons on paper over bark to see patterns.

114. Rain Stick Craft

Fill tubes with beans and cover with leaves to simulate rain sounds.

115. Leaf Mandalas

Arrange leaves in circles on paper, glue down to form mandalas.

116. Nature Crown

Weave flowers, leaves, and small sticks into wearable crowns.

117. Twig Letters

Glue small sticks into letter shapes on paper.

118. Flower Petal Paintings

Dip petals in paint and press onto paper for natural stamps.

119. Seed Pod Creatures

Glue seed pods together, add **googly eyes** to make creatures.

120. Acorn Cap Jewelry

Thread yarn through acorn caps for necklaces or bracelets.

Seasonal Art

121. Snowflake Cutting

Fold and cut paper to make unique snowflake patterns.

122. Pumpkin Painting

Paint small pumpkins with faces and patterns.

123. Leaf Painting

Press painted leaves onto paper for autumn art.

124. Valentine Heart Cards

Fold and decorate cards with stickers and glitter for Valentine's Day.

125. Easter Egg Decorating

Use stickers, paint, and markers on plastic or real eggs.

126. St. Patrick's Day Rainbows

Paint rainbows and glue cotton-ball clouds for a lucky craft.

127. Fourth-of-July Fireworks

Use toothbrush splatter with red, white, blue paint to mimic fireworks.

128. Thanksgiving Handturkey

Trace hands and decorate as turkeys with paint or markers.

129. Halloween Mask Making

Cut and decorate spooky or funny masks from paper plates.

130. New Year's Streamers

Twist colorful crepe paper into streamers to celebrate the new year.

131. Winter Scene Collage

Glue cotton balls for snow and paint trees on blue paper.

132. Spring Flower Wreath

Cut paper flowers, glue onto a ring for a spring door decoration.

133. Summer Beach Scene

Glue sand, shells, and draw umbrellas on paper.

134. Mother's Day Flower Bouquet

Create paper flowers and arrange in a hand-drawn vase.

135. Father's Day Tie Craft

Cut tie shapes, decorate, and attach to cards.

136. Hanukkah Menorah Drawing

Draw a menorah, paint candles in bright colors.

137. Diwali Diyas

Paint small clay or paper lamps and glue glitter for light-festive art.

138. Chinese New Year Dragons

Make dragon heads from paper and decorate with scales.

139. Earth Day Posters

Draw planet Earth, add drawings of trees and animals to promote care.

140. Halloween Pumpkin Collage

Glue orange paper bits to fill pumpkin outlines, then add faces.

Recycled Art

141. Cardboard Robot

Use boxes and tubes to build and paint robot figures.

142. Bottle Cap Magnets

Glue small pictures or paint inside caps, add magnet backs.

143. Toilet-Paper Roll Binoculars

Tape two rolls together, decorate, and add yarn for wearing.

144. Milk Jug Planters

Cut painted jugs into planters, fill with soil and seeds.

145. Tin Can Wind Chime

Paint cans, hang with string and beads for garden music.

146. CD Spinning Tops

Attach dowels through CDs, decorate, and spin.

147. Juice Box Birdhouse

Clean boxes, cut door, paint, and hang outside.

148. Egg Carton Caterpillar

(Repeat idea? Actually #93 above: but here show paint.) Paint each cup a different color and connect for a rainbow caterpillar.

149. Plastic Spoon Flowers

Cut spoon heads, paint, and glue around a painted bottle cap center.

150. Bubble Wrap Flowers

Cut bubble wrap petals, paint, and attach to sticks for stems.

151. Paper Bag Puppets

Decorate brown bags with eyes and fabric scraps for hand puppets.

152. Cereal Box Puzzle

Glue a drawing onto a box, cut into pieces for a jigsaw.

153. Shoe Box Diorama

Create a scene inside a box with paper figures and props.

154. Bottle Sculpture

Stack and glue cleaned bottles, paint to make towers.

155. CD Mosaic

Break old CDs into small pieces (adult-only!) and glue in patterns.

156. Yarn Wrapped Jars

Wrap jars in yarn and use as pencil holders.

157. Plastic Straw Weaving

Weave cut straws through cardboard slits to practice patterns.

158. Tin Foil Fruit

Crumple foil around paper fruit shapes for shiny textures.

159. Paper Roll Flowers

Cut slits in a roll, fan out, and paint for blossoms.

160. Magazine Bead Necklaces

Roll magazine strips into beads, varnish, and string.

Sensory Art

161. Shaving Cream Paint

Mix shaving cream with paint, spread on trays, and finger-paint.

162. Rice Sensory Bottles

Color rice with food coloring, fill bottles with rice and small toys.

163. Squishy Gel Bags

Fill sealable bags with gel and paint drops; kids squeeze to blend colors.

164. Foam Paint Squeezers

Use foam tubes filled with paint for squeeze-and-spread fun.

165. Cornstarch Slime Art

Make oobleck (cornstarch + water), add paint, and swirl on paper.

166. Bead Sorting Art

Glue sorted beads by color onto papers in rainbow patterns.

167. Kinetic Sand Play

Use colored kinetic sand and press shapes into it for textured art.

168. Puff Paint on Fabric

Apply puff paint to fabric scraps; microwave (adult-only) for 3D effect.

169. Scented Playdough

Add food extracts to playdough and sculpt scented shapes.

170. Gelatin Art

Mix gelatin with food coloring, paint on wax paper, let set, then peel off.

171. Cloud Dough Sculptures

Make cloud dough (flour + oil) and mold soft shapes.

172. Water Bead Painting

Place water beads on paper, paint around them for dot art.

173. Bubble Wrap Popping Art

Let children pop painted bubble wrap, then press onto paper.

174. Textured Paper Making

Blend used paper with water, add seeds, and press into new sheets.

175. Glow-In-The-Dark Slime

Mix glow paint into slime and sculpt under dim light.

176. Jelly Painting

Spread jelly on paper and press objects into it, then peel away.

177. Mud Kitchen Prints

Use mud as paint to stamp leaves and sticks onto cardboard.

178. Rainbow Rice Collage

Glue colored rice in layers on paper for a tactile rainbow.

179. Invisible Ink Art

Use lemon juice to draw, then heat gently to reveal the drawing.

180. Foam Clay Figures

Provide foam clay to squish and build small figures.

Mixed Media

181. Photo & Paint Hybrid

Paste a small photo, paint around it to create a scene extension.

182. Crayon & Watercolor

Draw with crayon, then paint with watercolor for resist effects.

183. Marker & Tissue Collage

Color with markers, glue tissue bits on top for layered color.

184. Chalk & Glue Glitter

Draw with sidewalk chalk on black paper, trace with glue, add glitter.

185. Sticker & Paint Scene

Place stickers, paint around them, peel stickers to reveal white shapes.

186. Stamp & Crayon Blends

Stamp shapes, then color inside with crayons for mixed textures.

187. Paper Cutting & Watercolor

Cut simple shapes, paint them, and glue onto a painted background.

188. String Art & Paint

Glue yarn zig-zags on paper, paint over, then remove yarn for abstract lines.

189. Foil & Tissue Lanterns

Wrap jars in tissue, overlay foil cutouts, shine a light inside.

190. Collage & Printmaking

Make a print background, then collage paper shapes on top.

191. Natural Dye Painting

Use beet or turmeric juice as paint on fabric scraps.

192. Magazine Paint-Over

Paint on magazine pages to create new abstract art.

193. Yarn & Bead Weaving

Weave yarn and beads together on cardboard looms.

194. Bubble Wrap & Crayon

Press crayon over bubble wrap-covered paper for raised-dot drawings.

195. Salt & Watercolor Mandalas

Glue salt lines in circle patterns, paint over with watercolors.

196. Fabric & Paper Collage

Combine small fabric scraps and paper shapes for a textured collage.

197. Chalk & Spray Bottle

Draw with chalk on sidewalk, spray water for smeared art.

198. Found Object Prints

Press small toys into paint and stamp as part of a mixed-media piece.

199. Glow Stick Painting

Crack glow sticks in dark room, paint with the glow liquid (adult-only).

200. Mirror Collage

Glue small safe mirror fragments onto cardboard with colored paper pieces for a sparkling mosaic.

Drawing

201. Starry Sky Drawing

Draw a dark sky with crayons, then add white or yellow stars to practice dots and space.

202. Rainy Day Scene

Sketch clouds and raindrops, then color with blue crayons to learn about weather.

203. Butterfly Wings

Draw half a butterfly on one side, fold, and rub to mirror the pattern on the other side.

204. Caterpillar Journey

Draw circles in a line, connect them, and add legs to make a caterpillar.

205. Hot Air Balloon Ride

Sketch a big balloon and basket, then color with bright patterns.

206. City Skyline

Draw simple rectangles as buildings, add windows with dots, and color the skyline.

207. Under the Bed Monster

Draw a silly monster peeking from under a bed to spark imagination.

208. Dinosaur Park

Sketch basic dinosaur shapes and color them with green and brown.

209. Flower Garden

Draw rows of flowers with different shapes—circles, hearts, stars.

210. Simple Maze

Draw a maze with crayons and have kids trace the path to a prize.

211. Moon Phases

Draw circles and shade parts to show full, half, and crescent moons.

212. Robot Face

Sketch simple squares and circles for eyes and mouth to build a robot.

213. Treasure Map

Draw an "X" on a paper island and decorate with trees and waves.

214. Beach Fun

Sketch waves, sand, and umbrellas, then color to practice horizontal lines.

215. Funny Faces

Draw a circle and add mismatched eyes, nose, and mouth for silly faces.

216. Magic Wand

Draw a stick and star, then add sparkles around it.

217. Birthday Cake

Sketch a cake with candles, then color layers and flames.

218. Snowman Family

Draw three circles for a snowman family and add hats and scarves.

219. Jungle Animals

Sketch big leaves and simple animal shapes like monkeys and parrots.

220. Treasure Chest

Draw a chest with coins and gems spilling out, then color gold and red.

Painting

221. Cotton Ball Clouds

Paint a sky, then glue painted cotton balls as clouds.

222. Straw Blown Paint

Drop paint blobs and blow through straws to spread color.

223. Glitter Glue Paint

Mix glitter into glue, draw shapes, and let dry for sparkle.

224. Flower Pot Painting

Paint a pot shape, then dab flower shapes on top with a brush.

225. Painted Pasta Necklaces

Paint large pasta shapes and string into necklaces when dry.

226. Thumbprint Bugs

Use thumbprints as bodies, then draw legs and antennae.

227. Salt & Paint Texture

Sprinkle salt on wet paint; let dry and brush off for a speckled look.

228. Drip Art

Let paint drip from brushes onto paper for abstract lines.

229. Paper Towel Tie-Dye

Fold paper towel, drop paint on edges, then open for patterns.

230. Bubble Paint Splash

Blow painted bubbles onto black paper to make bright spots.

231. Sand & Paint Mix

Mix sand into paint and spread for sandy texture.

232. Rice Stick Painting

Stick painted rice grains onto paper to form shapes.

233. Glove Painting

Dip a glove in paint, press on paper for hand-shaped prints.

234. Scratch Art Painting

Paint a paper black over a rainbow-painted sheet, then scratch to reveal colors.

235. Marbling with Oil

Drop oil-based paint in water, swirl, then press paper to lift marble design.

236. Wooden Spoon Paint Faces

Paint wooden spoons as people or animals and add details.

237. Salt Dough Painting

Paint baked salt-dough shapes like stars or hearts.

238. Tape Resist Painting

Place tape on paper, paint over, remove tape to show white lines.

239. Cereal Stamp Painting

Dip fruit-loop or cheerio groupings in paint to stamp shapes.

240. Handprint Flowers

Use handprints as petals around a painted circle center.

Collage

241. Foam Sticker Animals

Arrange foam stickers to build animal shapes on paper.

242. Pom-Pom Caterpillar

Glue pom-poms in a row, add paper eyes for a fuzzy caterpillar.

243. Paper Plate Sunflower

Paint a plate yellow, glue brown paper circles in center, add petals.

244. Magazine Face Collage

Cut eyes, nose, mouth from magazines to make funny faces.

245. Tissue Paper Rainbow Collage

Glue tissue squares in rainbow order on paper.

246. Feather Bird Collage

Glue feathers onto a drawn bird shape for soft wings.

247. Cupcake Liner Flowers

Flatten liners, glue in circles for petals, add painted center.

248. Cereal Box Letters

Cut letters from boxes, glue magazine pictures on each.

249. Yarn Heart Collage

Glue yarn loops onto a heart outline.

250. Recycled Paper Beads

Roll magazine strips, varnish, and string into necklaces.

251. Foil & Paper Fish

Glue foil scales on paper fish outlines.

252. Sequin Stars

Sprinkle glue on stars, stick sequins for sparkle.

253. Nature Smile Faces

Glue leaves and petals as hair and smiles on paper faces.

254. Button Trees

Glue buttons as leaves on a painted tree trunk.

255. Candy Wrapper Mosaics

Cut shiny wrappers into shapes, glue into patterns.

256. Paper Straw Weaving

Weave colored straws through slits in paper for a mini loom.

257. Magazine Flower Mandala

Cut petals from ads, arrange in circles.

258. Toilet Roll Owl Collage

Flatten and decorate rolls, add paper wings and eyes.

259. Pom-Pom Snowflake

Glue white pom-poms on paper snowflake cutouts.

260. Foam Shape Scene

Use foam cutouts (trees, houses) to build a landscape.

Printmaking

261. Bubble Wrap Skyline

Roll inked bubble wrap for building textures.

262. Cotton Swab Stars

Dip Q-tips in paint to stamp star patterns.

263. Toy Train Tracks

Roll painted toy trains to make track prints.

264. Potato Lanterns

Carve potato halves like lantern windows, stamp on paper.

265. String Loop Prints

Dip string in ink, press loops for abstract art.

266. Foam Sheet Stamps

Cut foam into shapes, stick on blocks, ink and print.

267. Plastic Lid Rings

Dip lids in paint, stamp circles in rows.

268. Footprint Flowers

Mold blocks and towers with playdough.

287. Egg Carton Monsters

Paint cartons, add eyes and teeth for funny monsters.

288. Foam Cup Snowman

Stack cups, paint white, add hat and scarf.

289. Cardboard Tube Binoculars

Decorate tubes, attach ribbon, and pretend to explore.

290. Straw Bridges

Tape straws together to build small bridges.

291. Pipe Cleaner Crowns

Twist crowns and decorate with beads.

292. Recycled Robot Sculpture

Stack boxes and tubes, glue buttons as controls.

293. Paper Mâché Globe

Dip paper strips in glue, layer over a ball, paint continents.

Wrap foil around shapes to make figures.

301. Flower Petal Garland

Thread petals on string to make necklaces.

302. Leafy Suncatchers

Press leaves in clear contact paper; hang in window.

303. Twig Stars

Glue sticks into star shapes, decorate with paint.

304. Pebble Bug Art

Glue pebbles as bug bodies, add painted legs.

305. Pressed Leaf Bookmarks

Press leaves, laminate between paper strips.

306. Acorn Cap Turtles

Glue acorn caps on paper as turtle shells.

307. Seed Necklace

String large seeds as beads for necklaces.

308. Rock Towers

Stack painted rocks outdoors.

309. Flower Stamp Cards

Dip petals in paint and stamp on cards.

310. Mud Footprints

Step in mud and press foot on paper for prints.

311. Branch Bird Perch

Glue small branch to paper, draw birds sitting on it.

312. Grass Brush Painting

Tie grass into a bundle; dip in paint and brush.

313. Nature Mandalas

Arrange stones and petals in circles on paper.

314. Shell Rubbing Art

Crayon-rub over shells under paper.

315. Twig Fairy Houses

Glue twigs around small boxes to make mini houses.

316. Leaf Crowns 2.0

Weave fresh leaves into headbands.

317. Flower Petal Collage

Glue petals onto paper shapes for texture.

318. Seed Pod Prints

Stamp pods in paint for textured dots.

319. Dried Flower Frames

Arrange and glue dried flowers around a photo.

320. Nature Gift Tags

Glue leaves and small flowers on cut-out tags.

Seasonal Art

321. Valentine Paint Hearts

Fold paper, paint one half, press to mirror heart.

322. Shamrock Scrunch Art

Glue green tissue scraps on shamrock outlines.

323. Easter Chick Collage

Glue yellow feathers and paper beaks on chick shapes.

324. Fourth-of-July Pinwheel

Fold and cut paper into pinwheels, attach to straws.

325. Pumpkin Seed Art

Glue pumpkin seeds in patterns on orange cards.

326. Snow Globe Painting

Paint winter scenes in circular frames, add glitter.

327. Thanksgiving Leaf Turkeys

Glue leaves as feathers around handprint turkeys.

328. Hanukkah Dreidel Collage

Glue blue and white paper shapes into dreidel forms.

329. Diwali Rangoli Designs

Draw patterns and fill with colored rice or sand.

330. Chinese Lantern Making

Cut and decorate red paper lanterns with gold stickers.

331. Spring Butterfly Prints

Paint one wing, fold to mirror on the other.

332. Summer Sun Collage

Glue yellow yarn as sun rays around a painted circle.

333. Autumn Leaf Weaving

Weave tissue strips through slits in leaf cutouts.

334. Winter Mitten Painting

Paint mitten shapes, sprinkle glitter for snow.

335. Birthday Streamer Art

Glue crepe paper strips in party scenes.

336. Mother's Day Handflower

Trace hand, cut out, and glue petals on paper.

337. Father's Day Tool Collage
