Drawing Activities

1. Make a picture of yourself using only straight lines.
2. Draw one thing from five different views and distances.

6. Draw a scene using only dots, not lines.

Visual Art Project Ideas for Beginners

1. **Basic Shape Drawing:** Practice drawing simple shapes like circles, squares, and triangles, then put them together to make easy pictures.
2. **Color Mixing Swatch Chart:** Mix red, blue, and yellow paints to see what new colors you get. Arrange them in a chart.
3. **Simple Still Life Drawing:** Draw a few items such as fruit or blocks, focusing on the outline and light shading.
4. **Crayon Resist Painting:** Draw with crayons on paper, then brush watercolor over it. The wax will keep the paint from covering your lines.
5. **Leaf Rubbings:** Place leaves under paper and rub with crayons or pencils to capture their shape and texture.
6. **Finger Painting:** Use your fingers to paint pictures, making fun abstract shapes or simple scenes.
7. **Collage with Magazine Clippings:** Cut out pictures from magazines and glue them on paper to make a themed collage.
8. **Painted Rocks:** Use acrylic paint to decorate smooth stones with patterns or characters.
9. **Bubble Wrap Printing:** Press paint-covered bubble wrap onto paper to make interesting textures.
10. **Salt and Watercolor:** Paint with watercolors, then sprinkle salt on the wet paint. Watch the salt soak up paint and make cool textures.
11. **Drawing with Charcoal:** Use charcoal sticks to sketch simple shapes, paying attention to light and dark areas.
12. **Paper Plate Masks:** Decorate paper plates with paint, markers, and yarn to create fun masks.
13. **Creating Patterns with Stamps:** Use household items or carved erasers as stamps to make repeating designs.
14. **Torn Paper Collage:** Tear colored paper into pieces and glue them down to form pictures or abstract shapes.
15. **Straw Blow Painting:** Put drops of watered-down paint on paper and blow through a straw to spread the color.
16. **Zentangle Inspired Drawing:** Fill a space with repeating patterns using a black pen.

17. **Object Tracing Art:** Trace outlines of everyday objects to make interesting groupings.
18. **Simple Origami:** Fold paper into easy shapes like cranes or boats following step-by-step instructions.
19. **Making Coiled Paper Art:** Roll strips of paper into coils and glue them down to build designs.
20. **Painting with Everyday Objects:** Use sponges, cotton balls, or forks to apply paint and make different textures.
21. **Creating a Scribble Drawing:** Draw a random scribble, then find shapes inside and outline them.

28. **Paper Chain Garland:** Cut strips of colored paper and link them into a chain to decorate rooms.
29. **Toilet Paper Roll Creatures:** Paint and decorate empty rolls to look like animals or fun characters.
30. **Symmetry Painting (Blotto Art):** Fold paper in half, put paint on one side, close it, and open to see matching shapes.
31. **Nature Collage on Contact Paper:** Stick leaves and flowers onto the sticky side of contact paper, then cover with another sheet.

32. **Handprint Art:** Use paint-covered hands to make prints you turn into animals or trees.
33. **Drawing with Stencils:** Place stencils on paper, trace the shapes, then color them in.
