Draw with colored pencils on sanded art board for rich pigment layering. 292. Combine digital sketch printout with hand-drawn enhancements using pen. 293. Experiment with folding and drawing on a paper sculpture for 3D effect. 294. Use oil pastel blended with turpentine for a painterly portrait. 295. Draw with white charcoal on toned paper, then add colored pencil highlights. 296. Create a cyanotype background and draw ink figures on top. 297. Use masking fluid in watercolor sketches to preserve white highlights. 298. Draw with graphite on transparent acetate, layer over colored paper. 299. Experiment with coffee and tea washes as low-key tonal backgrounds for ink drawings. 300. Combine spilled ink blots with structured pen drawing to form imaginative creatures.
