#### **Home Decor**

- 1. **Paint an accent wall.** Choose one wall, pick a bold or calming color, and repaint to change the mood of a room quickly.
- 2. **Make floating shelves.** Cut and mount simple wooden shelves to display books, plants, or photos.
- 3. **Create gallery wall frames.** Collect mismatched frames, paint them a single color, and arrange art/photos in a grid.
- 4. **DIY macramé wall hanging.** Use cotton cord and simple knots to make a textured statement piece for a living room.
- 5. **Stencil a pattern on furniture.** Use a foam stencil and paint to add a repeating pattern to a table or dresser.
- 6. **Make decorative throw pillow covers.** Sew or glue fabric to update pillows for any season.
- 7. **Create a fabric headboard.** Stretch foam and fabric over a wooden board and hang behind your bed for instant style.
- 8. **DIY window valance.** Sew a simple fabric strip or fold to dress up windows without full curtains.
- 9. **Build a pallet coffee table.** Sand, stack, and finish pallets into a low table with casters or legs.
- 10. **Make a rope-wrapped vase.** Wrap jute or cotton rope around a plain vase for a rustic look.
- 11. **Design custom coasters.** Use tiles, photos, resin, or cork to make drink coasters with personal designs.
- 12. **Create a seasonal wreath.** Use a foam or grapevine base and glue on seasonal foliage, ribbons, or ornaments.
- 13. **Apply peel-and-stick wallpaper.** Use removable wallpaper to add pattern to a small wall or closet back.

- 14. **Make a fabric lampshade cover.** Glue fabric to a plain lampshade to soften light and add pattern.
- 15. **Paint ombré furniture.** Blend two or three paint shades on a dresser drawer front for a gradient look.
- 16. **Create a photo ledge.** Attach narrow ledges to lean framed photos and rotate displays easily.
- 17. **DIY mirror frame.** Build or glue a frame around a plain mirror to give it a custom look.
- 18. **Scented drawer sachets.** Sew small fabric pouches and fill with dried lavender or cedar for fresh-smelling drawers.
- 19. **Make a chalkboard wall.** Paint a section with chalkboard paint for notes, menus, or kids' art.
- 20. **Create decorative terrariums.** Use glass jars, pebbles, soil, and succulents to make tiny indoor gardens.

### **Furniture & Woodworking**

- 21. **Build a basic bookshelf.** Make a simple vertical shelving unit from plywood and 2x4s for books and decor.
- 22. **Construct a bedside table.** Use reclaimed wood or plywood to make a small nightstand with a drawer.
- 23. **Make a bench with storage.** Build a bench with a hinged top for shoe or blanket storage.
- 24. **Refinish an old dresser.** Sand, repair, and repaint or stain an old dresser for a fresh finish.
- 25. **Upcycle a door into a table.** Add legs to an old wooden door for a rustic dining or console table.
- 26. **Build a window seat.** Create a framed seat with cushions and hidden storage underneath.
- 27. **Make a simple stool.** Cut three or four legs and a round seat for a handy small seating piece.
- 28. **Construct a Murphy desk.** Build a fold-up desk that tucks into a wall or cabinet for small spaces.
- 29. **Build a shoe rack.** Use slatted wood or angled shelves to make an entryway shoe organizer.

- 30. **Make a pallet garden table.** Convert pallets into a potting or patio table with shelves.
- 31. **Build a kids' play table.** Small scale, low-height wooden table perfect for crafts and play.
- 32. **Create a slatted headboard.** Vertical or horizontal slats painted or stained to fit any bedroom style.
- 33. **Make a TV media console.** Build a low TV stand with cable holes and storage for devices.
- 34. **Construct a potting bench.** A sturdy outdoor bench with workspace and storage for gardening tools.
- 35. **Build a Murphy bed (simple version).** Create a fold-down bed frame for guest rooms using plans and hardware.
- 36. **Make a corner shelf unit.** Triangular shelves to use awkward corners efficiently.
- 37. **Build picnic-style outdoor table.** Classic long table and benches for backyard gatherings.
- 38. **Construct a ladder bookshelf.** Leaning ladder-style shelves for plants and books.
- 39. **Craft a wooden wine rack.** Horizontal or vertical wine storage from reclaimed wood.

- 92. **Make a planter from a broken sink.** Use an old sink basin as a quirky outdoor planter.

- 114. **Set up voice-controlled routines.** Use an assistant to run lights, music, and reminders with one phrase.

- 147. **Make gift wrap from kraft paper.** Stamp or paint plain paper to create custom wrapping.

- 158. **Install smoke and CO detector batteries.** Test and replace batteries for home safety.

- 159. **Make a fire extinguisher check tag.** Note inspection dates and mount near the extinguisher.
- 160. Repair a squeaky door hinge. Lubricate or tighten hinges for quiet doors.
- 161. **Replace a broken tile.** Remove the damaged tile and set a new one with adhesive and grout.
- 162. **Re-caulk around tubs and sinks.** Remove old caulk and apply a fresh bead to prevent leaks and mold.

### **Energy & Sustainability**

- 163. **Install weatherstripping on doors/windows.** Reduce drafts and lower heating/cooling bills.
- 164. **Make draft stoppers for doors.** Sew or fill fabric tubes with sand or rice to block cold air.
- 165. **Set up LED lighting swap.** Replace old bulbs with LEDs to cut energy use and last longer.
- 166. **Create a simple solar light project.** Use small solar cells to power pathway lights or jars.
- 167. **Build a clothesline or drying rack.** Air-dry clothes to save energy and extend clothing life.
- 168. **Compost kitchen scraps.** Start a small indoor or outdoor compost for garden nutrients.
- 169. **Make reusable beeswax wraps.** Fabric + beeswax for replacing single-use plastic wrap.
- 170. **Install faucet aerators.** Reduce water flow while keeping pressure for water savings.
- 171. **DIY rain garden planning.** Plant a garden that absorbs and filters rain where water pools.
- 172. **Create upcycled insulation covers.** Use old blankets to insulate windows in cold months safely.

## **Textiles & Sewing**

173. **Sew blackout curtain panels.** Block light and improve sleep with lined curtains.

- 174. **Make a quilt from old shirts.** Cut squares from sentimental shirts and stitch into a quilt.
- 175. **DIY fabric napkins.** Cut and hem cloth napkins to reduce paper waste and add style.
- 176. **Create a slipcover for furniture.** Sew a removable cover to refresh a sofa or chair.
- 177. **Make reusable produce bags.** Light mesh or cotton bags for grocery shopping.
- 178. **Sew a pet bed.** Use durable fabric and stuffing to make a washable bed for pets.
- 179. **Repair a torn seam.** Use quick hand stitching or a machine to mend clothing and extend life.
- 180. **Make a robe or lounge wrap.** Soft fabric cut and sewn into a comfy home robe.
- 181. **Create decorative fabric baskets.** Stiffened fabric or interfacing to make storage baskets.
- 182. **Sew a window valance.** Quick hemmed fabric to dress windows without heavy sewing.
- 183. **Make cloth gift bags.** Reusable wrap that doubles as part of the gift presentation.
- 184. **Dye fabric with natural dyes.** Use onion skins, tea, or turmeric to color textiles naturally.

### **Kitchen & Food Projects**

- 185. **Build a spice drawer insert.** Make a slanted insert so spice jars are easy to read and grab.
- 186. **Make infused oils and vinegars.** Flavor oils with herbs or chilies for cooking and gifts.
- 187. **Create a coffee station.** Arrange a corner with jars, mugs, and a tray for morning routines.
- 188. **Construct a magnetic knife strip.** Mount a magnetic bar to free counter space and store knives safely.
- 189. **Make homemade pickles or preserves.** Preserve seasonal produce in jars for later use.

- 190. **DIY bread box from wood.** A ventilated wooden box keeps bread fresh longer.
- 191. **Create a lazy Susan for cabinets.** A rotating tray to access items in deep cupboards easily.
- 192. **Make a recipe binder.** Organize printed and handwritten recipes into a labeled, easy-to-use binder.

## **Bathroom & Plumbing**

- 193. **Build a shower caddy.** Use suction baskets or a tension rod with hanging baskets to organize shower items.
- 194. **Install a rainfall shower head.** Swap the existing head for a more luxurious shower experience.
- 195. **Make a soap dispenser from pump bottles.** Refill pretty dispensers with liquid soap or lotion.
- 196. **Build a towel ladder or rack.** Wooden ladder style to hang towels in small bathrooms.

## Lighting

- 197. **Make a pendant light from a basket.** Turn a wicker basket into a lamp shade with a bulb kit.
- 198. **Create LED strip accent lighting.** Hide LED strips under cabinets, shelves, or behind TVs for ambient glow.
- 199. **Build a motion-sensor night light.** Small battery LEDs with sensors for hallways and closets.
- 200. **Design a paper lantern chandelier.** Cluster paper lanterns at varying heights for soft overhead light.

# How to plan a DIY project (quick guide)

- 1. **Define the outcome** a list or sketch of what you want.
- 2. Make a materials & tools list exact quantities.
- 3. Estimate time & budget include a small buffer.
- 4. **Read or watch one tutorial** for the technique you'll use.
- 5. Prepare workspace & safety gear (glasses, gloves, mask).

- 6. Do a small test (paint on scrap wood, measure twice).
- 7. **Execute step-by-step** don't rush. Finish sanding/finishing well.

# Essential tools & materials (starter kit)

Basic tools that cover most home DIYs:

- Tape measure, pencil, combination square
- Hand saw or jigsaw (beginners can start with hand tools)
- Screwdriver set (Phillips + flat) and drill with bits
- Hammer, pliers, adjustable wrench
- Sandpaper (various grits) and sanding block
- Paintbrushes or foam rollers, painter's tape
- Utility knife, glue (wood glue + strong adhesive), clamps
- Safety: safety glasses, dust mask, work gloves

Common materials: wood boards, screws, nails, paint, stain, basic hardware (hinges, knobs), fabric, hooks, baskets, planters, adhesive strips.

# Safety tips

- Always wear safety glasses and a mask when cutting or sanding.
- Unplug power tools when changing bits.
- Work in a ventilated area for paints/solvents.
- Keep a first-aid kit nearby.
- Use clamps to hold small pieces never hold with your hand while cutting.
- Read tool manuals and follow instructions.

# **Budget & time planning**

- **Tiny crafts** (painted pots, coasters): ₹0–₹500, 30–90 minutes.
- **Small builds** (shelves, planters): ₹500–₹3,000, 2–8 hours.
- Medium projects (cabinet doors, accent wall): ₹3,000–₹15,000, weekend or multiple days.
- Larger builds (furniture, decking): ₹15,000+, several days to weeks.

Tip: Reuse or upcycle materials to cut costs. Borrow one-off tools if you don't plan to use them often.

# Step-by-step mini example — Floating Shelf (quick how-to)

- 1. Measure & mark: Decide location, measure height and stud placement.
- 2. **Cut & finish wood**: Cut board to length, sand edges, apply stain or paint.
- 3. **Install brackets**: Attach brackets into studs using screws and a level.
- 4. Mount shelf: Place the shelf on brackets and secure from beneath.
- 5. **Style & test**: Let finish dry, then add light items and test hold.

## **Troubleshooting & tips**

- **Paint drips?** Sand lightly once dry and apply a second thin coat.
- **Shelf wobbles?** Check bracket alignment and tighten screws; use better anchors if no stud.
- Glue not holding? Use clamps and allow full cure time (read glue label).
- Stain blotchiness? Pre-condition soft woods with a wood conditioner.
